	1. Sign at Alcide Trudeau Park Back in the fall of 2017, the VCA asked for a grant and we received 32K from the City. Jean worked with the City to finalize some of the details (e.g. permit, removal of original sign, specs, etc). However, before the holidays, Jean ran into issues with electricity and the project was placed on hold for the winter. Jean met with councilor Blais this week to discuss the future of the project. Councillor Blais mentioned that the sign that we originally proposed will be more expensive than the 32K originally reserved for the project. He is now looking at alternative options.	Councillor Blais will send alternative options for the sign to the VCA.
	2. Community Centre in Alcide Trudeau Park This project has been Vars' priority for a few years now. The construction of a new community centre in Alcide Trudeau would be approximately 2M, of which, the city has reserved 1M.	
	All levels of government were approached to come up	

	with the remaining 1M without any success.	
	Due to various elections approaching, this project will be placed on hold until 2019 (because of the elections, we are not expecting to receive any funding for a while). 	3. Taggart Miller Councillor Blais mentioned that the Taggart Millier facility will give money to surrounding communities, similarly to the Friends of mer bleue (money per ton). The amount is expected to be 6M, which would represent 225,000\$ per year, to be shared between the surrounding communities.

Appendix A: President's Comments

Good evening, bonsoir, and welcome to the 2018 VCA's Annual General Meeting.

Firstly, I wish to thank my colleagues, members of the VCA for their committed hard work for our community as well as all residents and supporters who have come forward to give us a hand in ensuring the best interests of our community.

I wish to take a few moments to run down the activities that your association has been involved with over the past year.

We have held monthly meetings, where as a team, we have reviewed issues, projects, concerns and priorities of interest for the village.

Each member has had numerous one-on-one meetings with residents, our elected representatives, potential entrepreneurs and City officials to determine what else can be done to improve our village.

Over the year, we have been involved with:

- The Remembrance Day ceremony
- Cenotaph maintenance
- Rink management
- Canada Day celebrations supporting the Optimist Club
- Alcide Trudeau Park construction proposal which is still being contemplated, pending funding
- Key agent for Alcide Trudeau Park and Bearbrook centre
- Summer youth program which has been postponed again this year due to lack of registrations
- Community garden maintenance which is somewhat being used
- The annual Christmas tree lighting

Obviously, we did not do all of this alone nor did we do just that. While we have many friends throughout the community, our main partners have been Councillor Blais, his staff, especially Jason Coulas, and City officials, the school and most of all, the Optimist Club members.

On the financial side, the VCA is in good financial health. We had decided to split our savings under different categories for better management and planning exercises. The VCA receives very limited funding other that from the City for specific activities like the rink and key agent. Over the years, while we have sponsored community activities and acquired some items for the community, we still manage to have some \$29,000 in the bank.

We are in good business standing with Corporations Canada as well as with Revenue Canada, having filed our corporate tax returns on time.

We are keeping an eye on the proposed development of the Taggart-Miller waste recovery plant as we now have VCA representation on the community steering committee.

The establishment of Amazon in our backyard will certainly be beneficial for our economic growth and market value for our properties.

With the recent weather devastations in our region, the VCA, with the cooperation of the school, parishes, local firefighters and City officials, is launching the process for an emergency preparedness program for our community and will allocate some funds to this initiative, just in case the misfortunes come our way ...!

We have hosted these community BBQs and movie night in the park events to bring the community closer together. This compliments the terrific work already done by the school and the Optimist Club in support of our community social wellbeing.

The VCA has been working with the Carlsbad Springs Community Association in developing a community radio station to serve our community. This would be a perfect communication tool for the village especially during emergencies.

We are still working with city officials to replace our signage information board at the park or fire station for an electronic module, facilitating our messaging to the community.

We have supported the school and city officials in finding a secured access to our school premises for the now 5 school buses that park in front of the school as well as for the drop off of the children by parents.

The VCA had contemplated seeking funding for a tennis court at Casandra Park. However, this would be a "nice to have" as no funding seems available at this time for this project.

The biggest challenge remains finding volunteers. We do notice that not only for the VCA but also the Optimist Club and parish organizations are having more and more trouble finding community members to help out. The solution is not that obvious and we all need urgent help in finding ways to increase community participation, otherwise programs will fall short. A perfect example is the Market Mobile initiative and to some extent the summer youth program.

We are putting a special call out to students who require community work hours to complete their curriculum. We also need community input on what will make our village better, both economically and socially, for the benefit of all, young and old.

While Vars is a so-called bedroom community, it is expanding with many new and young families. We are most fortunate to have the St-Guillaume school at our disposal and the terrific group of committed teachers to help out. Every single one of us makes the community what it is and we only can shape its future through our participation and ideas. This is what the VCA is all about. Merci.

President's Report – September 20, 2019

Good evening, bonsoir, and welcome to the 2019 VCA's Annual General Meeting. Bienvenue à notre réunion générale annuelle. We hope that you have enjoyed the BBQ and that you will stay for our movie night under the stars, well at least, under the pavilion.

Firstly, I wish to thank my colleagues, members of the VCA for their committed hard work and time for our community as well as all residents and supporters who have come forward to give us a hand in ensuring the best interests of our community. A special thanks to Jenny Ashdown, our Treasurer, who is stepping down and leaving our rural and quiet environment to move to the BIG CITY...

Throughout the year, we have held monthly meetings, where as a team, we have reviewed issues, projects, concerns and priorities of interest for the village. Each member has had numerous one-on-one meetings with residents, our elected representatives, potential entrepreneurs and City officials to determine what else can be done to improve our village.

Over the year, we have been involved with: • The Remembrance Day ceremony • Cenotaph maintenance • Rink management • supporting the Optimist Club in their activities • Key agent for Alcide Trudeau Park and Bearbrook centre • The annual Christmas tree lighting, etc. and we are planning to bring back some daytime activities to the park for Canada Day, minus the fireworks. Obviously, we did not do all of this alone nor did we do just that. While we have many friends throughout the community, our main partners have been Councillor Blais, his staff, and City officials, the school and most of all, the Optimist Club members. On behalf of the community, we are most grateful for their support.

On the financial side, the VCA is in good financial health. The VCA receives very limited funding other that from the City for specific activities like the rink and key agent. Over the years, while we have sponsored community activities and acquired some items for the community, we still manage to have some \$29,000 in the bank. We are in good business standing with Corporations Canada as well as with Revenue Canada, having filed our corporate tax returns on time.

We are keeping an eye on the proposed development of the Taggart-Miller waste recovery plant as we now have VCA representation on the community steering committee. The establishment of Amazon in our backyard will certainly be beneficial for our economic growth and market value for our properties. We have hosted these types of community BBQs and movie nights in the park events to bring the community closer together. This compliments the terrific work already done by the school and the Optimist Club in support of our community social wellbeing.

The VCA has been working with the Carlsbad Springs Community Association in developing a community radio station to serve our community. This would be a perfect communication tool for the village especially during emergencies. The signage information board at the fire station has been changed, facilitating our messaging to the community. Our website has now been redesigned to inform the community and new comers of what Vars is all about. The biggest challenge remains finding volunteers. We do notice that not only for the VCA but also the Optimist Club and parish organizations are having more and more trouble finding community members to help out. The solution is not that obvious and we all need urgent help in finding ways to increase community participation, otherwise programs will fall short. We are putting a special call out to students who require community work hours to complete their curriculum. We also need community input on what will make our village better, both economically and socially, for the benefit of all, young and old.

While Vars is a so-called bedroom community, it is expanding with many new and young families. We are most fortunate to have the St-Guillaume school at our disposal and the terrific group of committed teachers to help out. Every single one of us makes the community what it is and we are the only people that can shape its future through our participation and ideas. Vars is our community, our responsibility.

Appendix A

This is further to my e-mail of September 27, 2019 advising Members of Council that the Provincial Government is accepting applications for the *Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program – Community, Culture and Recreation* program. Each member of Council was invited to identify one priority project for their ward, as well as to suggest larger regional projects for consideration as part of the City's application package.

A project for each ward was received over the last few weeks, as well as a number of regional projects. After staff review of the projects against compatibility with funding criteria and as a result of consultation with Provincial officials on eligibility, 36 applications for funding have been prepared for submission to the Province on or before the November 12, 2019 application deadline.

The attachment to this e-mail identifies the list of projects the City is applying for. Each application will indicate that the project is a priority in the geographic area where it is located. Renewal proposals were developed in alignment with the City's lifecycle renewal program.

The City should receive the results of the Provincial assessment in early winter. Once the province has completed their assessment projects will be considered by the Federal Government for final approval in the spring/summer of 2020.

Ottawa Ward Review, Vars leaving Cumberland Ward to join Osgoode Ward

On December 7, 2020, members of the Vars Community Association (VCA) held a special meeting to review the recent City proposal to split the Cumberland Ward into three segments one of which would have the communities of Vars and Carlsbad Springs joining the Osgoode Ward in 2022 or later.

While this proposal was never entertained with the VCA before being introduced as a viable "option 7" in the City's ward review exercise, we have had the opportunity to review the pros and cons of this merger with the Osgoode Ward and are confident that, in the best interests of our village and our commitment to keeping it as rural as possible as described to City Council in 2009 through the Vars Neighbourhood Plan, at the outset, we cannot support this latest option without further consultations with officials and our residents.

While being part of Osgoode Ward would most likely allow Vars to prosper economically and socially faster while maintaining its special status as a rural community within our City instead of a being a small suburban extension of an overwhelming growing community like Orléans, we do have to factor in the matter of our linguistic representation, the impact on school zoning, high school attendance, sports competitions, community organizations, etc. Over a century, our community has built a partnership of eastern Ottawa rural communities, along with the support of all parties within the City. We continue to strive to work for the development of the 417 corridor to ensure a fair balance between our farm lands, our forests and any potential economic and environmentally friendly growth to benefit all our residents.

Over the past few years, Vars has become an even more vibrant community where new residents, young families, professionals and retirees, join the community to enjoy the tranquility, the open air of country living while remaining some twenty minutes away from the City's urban centres. Vars might be enjoying the best of both worlds with an historical and cultural background, a proud community offering spiritual, educational and sporting availabilities. Vars is a community where Anglophone and Francophone residents have built a united front to foster a bilingual country style living environment for generations. It has done so with Navan, Carlsbad Springs, Sarsfield and even as far as Cumberland... We are not convinced that being segregated from our long time neighbours to fit into the Osgoode Ward is in our best interests.

Vars continues to work with other communities from other Wards as we are all part of the same City. However, this "Option 7" needs to be reviewed, openly debated with concerned parties and professionals in the field while respecting the political implications and consequences of the final outcome. We therefore recommend that Council delay its decision until further proper public consultations be held on this latest option.
